

New Requirements for Generation Permits

On April 8, 2015, the Energy Regulatory Commission ("CRE") published the new requirements for power generation permits in the Official Gazette. According to the document, CRE evaluates (i) the legal existence of the applicant, (ii) the technical ability and financial standing and solvency of the applicant or the business group the applicant pertains to, and (iii) the technical feasibility of the generation project.

The requirement to prove the technical ability and

financial standing and solvency when applying for a generation permit is new. It includes that the applicant has to submit documents to CRE, such as, letters of intent or irrevocable credits that secure the financing of the investment required to develop the project in accordance to its business plan.
