

New Requirements for Suppliers

The recent energy reform in Mexico has transformed the operation of the electric power sector in the country. The Law of Electric Industry ("LIE") determines that activities related to generation, transmission, distribution and commercialization of electricity must be carried out independently.

On June 12th, 2015 the project of the General Requirements to obtain a Supplier Permit was submitted to the Federal Commission on Regulatory Improvement ("COFEMER") for review and subsequent approval. The modalities of the Suppliers are: a) Supplier of Basic Services; b) Supplier of Qualified Services; and, c) Supplier of Last Resource.

In accordance to the new electric scheme, Generators will obtain a permit to produce electricity but must act through a Supplier or through the Wholesale Electricity Market ("WEM") for its delivery to final users. Since the Rules of the Electricity

However, the LIE has precisely defined the role and modalities of Suppliers' activities for providing electricity to final users.
